Dear Parents and Carers,

We began the week by learning about the legacy of Dr Martin Luther King Jr. The children explored who he was and why he is such an important figure in history. We talked about his role as a civil rights leader and how he worked tirelessly to challenge unfair treatment in the United States. The children learned about his commitment to peaceful protest, including events such as the Montgomery Bus Boycott and the March on Washington, where he delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech. Alongside his achievements, we reflected on the resilience Dr King showed during very difficult times, discussing how he continued to stand up for equality, kindness and justice even when faced with great challenges.



Mrs Burton also led an assembly inspired by the work of psychologist Angela Duckworth. She explained Duckworth's idea of grit. Mrs Burton talked about how success is not just about talent but about working hard, staying motivated, and not giving up when things are difficult. She shared examples of how making mistakes and facing challenges can help us learn and improve.

We would also like to share that Mrs Stanley will be starting her maternity leave after half term. We know many families and children will want to join us in wishing her all the very best at this special and exciting time. We look forward to welcoming her back in the future and wish her and her family happiness and good health as they prepare for this new chapter.

Finally, staff have recently taken part in training with Majestick Golf, focusing on the "Little Sticks" programme. This training has equipped staff with fun, engaging ways to introduce golf skills that support coordination, focus and confidence. The team thoroughly enjoyed the training session and are looking forward to teaching the children throughout the year, helping them to develop new skills while staying active and having fun.

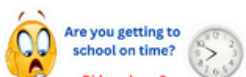
Admissions Policy 2027 Entry

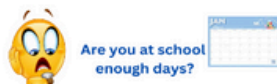

ATTENDANCE LADDER



Are you getting to school on time?
Did you know?

5 minutes late every day = 15 hours a year = 3 days of learning
10 minutes late every day = 30 hours a year = 6 days of learning
15 minutes late every day = 45 hours a year = 9 days of learning
20 minutes late every day = 60 hours a year = 12 days of learning
25 minutes late every day = 75 hours a year = 15 days of learning

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Your child's progress academically as well as socially is our shared priority.

The Supreme Court has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wight 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The law states a leave of absence may only be granted by a school if an application is made in advance and if it considers there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. Schools must judge each application individually considering the specific facts and circumstances and relevant background context behind each request.

A leave of absence is granted entirely at the school's discretion. Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance. Where a leave of absence is granted, the school will determine the number of days a pupil can be absent from school.

When making an application for Leave of Absence parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. The school may also request further information on the application and supporting documentation where appropriate. It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is the parents' responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child is expected to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence. Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'. All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council. Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices and in the first instance, as an alternative to prosecution proceedings.

The law relating to Penalty Notices changed with effect from 19 August 2024. Therefore, Penalty Notices issued for Leave of Absence taken from September 2024 will be issued in accordance with the updated legislation.

- Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices - 4 in total).

- First Leave of Absence offence: The Penalty Notice amount of £160 to be paid within 28 days, this is reduced to £80 each child if paid within 21 days.
- Second Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): The amount of £160 paid within 28 days. No reduced amount.

- Payment plans will not be offered and/or payments received outside of the 28 day period will not be accepted. Where a penalty notice expires unpaid the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider criminal prosecution.

- Third Leave of Absence offence within a 3 year period (from the date of issue of the first penalty notice): A penalty notice will not be issued and the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal prosecution proceedings under s444 of Education Act 1996.

Tips For Wellness Learning

We are always learning new things – often without realising it! Learning can include developing skills as well as developing knowledge. Learning something new can help to improve our mental wellbeing, as it gives us a sense of achievement and purpose. We can challenge ourselves to build new skills or develop skills that we already have. It can help to build motivation, confidence, and self-esteem too.

To help us to learn something new, we can set ourselves a challenge or a goal to work towards. Can you think of a new challenge or goal to try?

Learning can be fun! Studies show that learning can help us to enjoy life more! Can you find a new activity that you enjoy and make it part of your life?

Our tips for learning:

- 1. Learn a new word each day!** Can you use the new word in your schoolwork? Can you teach this new word to a friend?
- 2. Get creative!** Try a new craft activity or write a story or song. Have a look at some ideas for craft activities here:
- 3. Try a new hobby,** such as a new sport, learning to paint or join a new after-school club.
- 4. Try a new food or learn to cook a new recipe.** Could you share this experience with someone? For example, could you bake a cake with a friend, or cook a meal for your family?
- 5. Learn a new language.** Try and learn simple words and phrases, such as "hello", "how are you?" and "my name is...". You could use online resources or apps, such as Duolingo, to help you.
