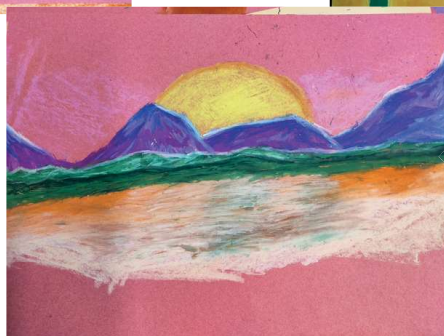
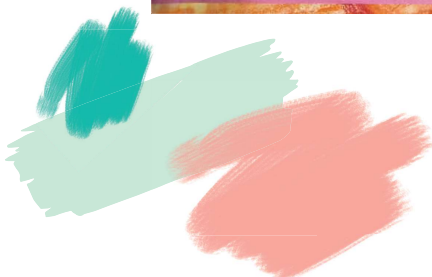

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about YOUTUBE KIDS

As its name suggests, YouTube Kids is a child-friendly version of Google's online video-sharing platform. Its colourful user interface is designed with young people in mind, and it offers a curated, family-friendly experience with features like age-based content settings and parental controls.

AGE RESTRICTION 4+

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

- INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT BYPASSING FILTERS**: YouTube Kids has been known to allow inappropriate content to bypass filters. This content has been reported to the site by users, including parents and educators. One example involved a video showing a young child being sexually abused. Other inappropriate content includes videos that promote self-harm, violence, or other harmful behaviors. These videos can be accessed by children as young as four, as inappropriate content has bypassed the platform's algorithms and human moderators.
- BE WARY OF ADVERTISING**: Like Google's regular YouTube app, YouTube Kids features pervasive advertising before a video starts. While these ads are designed to be family-friendly and are subject to a strict review process, it is worth noting that YouTube Kids collects information on users' viewing history to inform targeted content and advertisements.
- DESIGNED TO BE ADDICTIVE**: YouTube Kids is designed to be addictive. The platform's design features, such as the automatic playback of related videos and the "autoplay" feature, can be very engaging and make it difficult for children to control when they stop watching. Research has shown that spending too much time using digital devices can lead to screen addiction, affecting children's daily routines, studies, and even their social skills.
- SETTINGS CAN BE CIRCUMVENTED**: YouTube Kids offers both a parental control system, enabling you to set screen time limits and control what content children can view. However, children can often more easily bypass these controls than you think. They can easily bypass or reset these settings if they have access to the associated Google account password, thereby exposing themselves to age-inappropriate and potentially dangerous content.
- AI-GENERATED MISINFORMATION**: There is a risk of children accessing videos that contain disinformation and propaganda. A BBC investigation found that some YouTube channels are using artificial intelligence (AI) to generate videos that are recommended to children as educational content. These videos included conspiracy theories and claims that lack scientific soundness.
- DATA COLLECTION RISK**: While there are links on the site that YouTube can opt out of children under 13, children can still inadvertently give away sensitive information when using YouTube Kids. The platform collects data on children's viewing habits, content searches and location, which YouTube then uses to personalize content.

Advice for Parents & Educators

- PARENTAL CONTROLS**: YouTube Kids offers several settings that allow you to manage what content children can view. For example, you can choose what level of content you want them to access, such as "Restricted" or "All Ages". You can also turn off the search function, so that only those videos approved by YouTube Kids remain featured on the app or a child's recommended list.
- SET TIME LIMITS**: This app is a parental control tool that lets you set a limit on how long children spend watching videos. You can set an amount that fits your screen time and schedule the YouTube Kids app to be available only during those times. It also allows you to schedule the app to be unavailable during certain times of the day, such as during school hours, to ensure that screen time is focused on other, more important activities.
- CHECK WATCH HISTORY**: YouTube Kids has made it easy for you to keep an eye on what the children in your care have been watching on the app. By clicking on the "Watch History" icon at the top right of the home screen, you can see which videos they've been viewing, and how much of each. If a child watches YouTube Kids and you have any concerns, you can check their history through Google's "My Activity" page.
- WATCH TOGETHER**: It's important that you try to make YouTube Kids a fun and positive experience for children. One way to do this is by introducing watching together, where you sit together and watch the content. It's also worth speaking to children about the dangers of spending too much time on YouTube, to ensure that screen time is focused on other, more important activities.

Tips For Wellness
Be active

Moving our body every day can boost self-esteem, improve quality of sleep, contribute to better social skills and reduce feelings of anxiety. When we feel anxious, our bodies can experience the 'fight, flight, freeze' response. Our hearts beat faster, we sweat more, and our muscles tense; physical activity can help release these feelings!

Our brain also releases chemicals when we exercise, called endorphins, that make us feel good. Even just 10 minutes of fast walking can contribute to mental alertness, increased energy and positive mood.

Being active may be new to you, or you may already exercise regularly. Try to find an activity that you want to do, and you find enjoyable. It's okay if you aren't sure what this is yet, have a go at experimenting and why not start by checking out our ideas for being active below?

Our tips for being active:

- Add extra movement to your regular routine** – Can you change the way you travel to school? Could you walk or cycle to your friend's house, instead of travelling by car? If you need to use the car, think about parking further away to get some extra steps in!
- You could engage in the 'Daily Mile' as a class or whole school! This involves heading outside to run, wheel or walk around the school grounds for 15-minutes every day, at whatever pace suits you.
- Try a new sport or activity** – This is a great way to improve your sporting ability, but also an opportunity to make new friends and feel part of a team.
- Dance to music** - Whilst it can be a good idea to join a sports club if you enjoy this type of activity, we can still be active whilst listening to music and having fun! You could dance to your favourite playlist whilst you are tidying your bedroom or helping your parents/carers around the house... you might even forget you are doing chores too!
- Get outdoors** and move your body in the fresh air. If the weather is cold or rainy, why not try Zumba, hula hooping, skipping, or yoga.

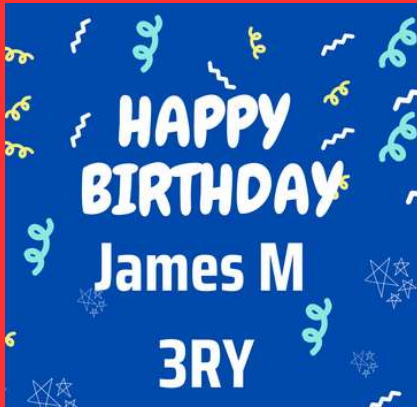
